



Athlete Code of Conduct

Uniform

Athletes are expected to dress in an appropriate manner in order to reflect a positive image on themselves and the rest of the team. Athletes are expected to wear team travel uniform when traveling (found at Kitlocker.com renewed for 2026/27). Athletes are expected to wear team clothing when training (snow & physical) and at official functions such as prize giving ceremonies. Athletes may wear British Team uniforms at official National Team events such as GB FIS Childrens events, EYOF, Youth Olympics, World Junior Champs & World Champs (at all other events they are required to wear Ambition Race Team uniform).

Travel

Staff and athletes are expected to be pleasant, polite and respectful towards restaurant, hotel, airline, and ski area staff at all times.

Accommodation

Athletes are responsible for any and all happenings within their room whether at or away from base. This includes other athletes entering the room, their possessions within the room and any breakages that occur within their room. *Entering another athlete's bedroom is prohibited regardless of gender at both the Ambition base and away.*

Personal Belongings and Medication

All athletes under the age of 18 are required to hand in all important documents & medicines to the Ambition pastoral staff for safekeeping. Any personal belongings brought on trips and kept in an athletes' own possession are done so at their own risk. Inhalers & Epi-Pens can be kept in bags for on the hill emergency use. All athletes (of any age) must notify staff when using any form of medication.

Curfews

Coaches and house parents may set curfews; they will reflect the age and needs of each athlete/team and are to be adhered to.

Bullying

Athletes are expected to be respectful of their fellow competitors and teammates. All athletes have a responsibility to ensure they are fair and considerate to others. In the event of bullying accusations, an investigation will be carried out and governing bodies contacted for further guidance.

E-Safety

Ambition athletes are expected to use the internet & social media appropriately and in a way that does not bring either themselves, nor Ambition into disrepute.

Overseas Laws

Ambition athletes are required to abide by the laws governed by the country / countries where we may train or compete.

Disciplinary Process

Minor cases will be dealt with in-house through verbal reminders & / or written warnings. Athletes may be required to miss training / race days. In more severe cases or repeat cases that the Ambition staff believe constitutes Gross Misconduct (including but not limited to; bullying, smoking, stealing, drug or nicotine usage, safeguarding breaches including entering another persons room at any time with or without consent) parents will be contacted immediately & athletes will be removed from the daily program, suspended (sent home) or removed from the team permanently. The consequence for Gross Misconduct will (in most cases) result in suspension or expulsion from the Ambition program for a period of time. In all disciplinary cases, any & all consequences resulting in suspension or exclusion from the programme, will be at the athletes' (and therefore families') own expense.
